Wishing for a new tablet this holiday? Keep these security tips in mind to stay on the nice list.

- Password protect your tablet. It's the first line of defense if the device is lost.
- Set up remote wipe. It lets you erase all information on the device if it's stolen. This feature requires some advance setup. See www.lookout.com.
- Be careful what you click. Protect your tablet like your desktop or laptop. Avoid clicking Internet ads. Delete spam texts and emails.

Before you leave for break, set up Self-Service Password Reset (SSPR), so you can reset your NetID password on your own if you forget it. Campus Mobile Use on the Rise

Research shows we're using mobile devices more and more.

TAMULink wireless usage is skyrocketing. September 17 usage set a record with 58,221 unique users and over 1.6 million sessions. Compared to September 11, 2011, that's more than a 200 percent increase in sessions and a 40 percent increase in users!

On the first day of school, Howdy Mobile logins were almost twice as common as desktop logins: 56,714 Mobile and only 29,132 desktop logins. Howdy Mobile usage increased almost 800 percent since its release in January 2012. Average daily logins increased from 3,433 in the first month to 27,156 by August 2012.
