New & Noteworthy

- **Michael A. Sardaryzadeh assumed his role as Associate Vice President for Cybersecurity, Policy and Compliance and the Chief Information Security Officer (CISO) on February 5.** Dr. Sardaryzadeh was previously CISO for Prime Healthcare, one of the nation's largest for-profit healthcare systems in the country. He also served as Director of Cybersecurity for General Electric.
- **The Texas A&M University System is utilizing Laserfiche to archive information from the decommissioned Buy A&M (BAM) Purchasing System.** BAM was phased out in November after running the system became cost prohibitive. The Division of Information Technology has worked with the System to import over 1.7 million documents. More information can be found at it.tamus.edu/bam
- **Judith H. - **The first IT Forum for 2018 is scheduled for Tuesday, March 6, at 3 p.m. in Rudder 601.** Scott Bauer, Director of Recruitment and Workforce Planning for the Texas A&M Division of Human Resources, will present "Hiring and Retaining a Diverse Staff." - **Replacement of Network Address Translation (NAT) hardware and software is underway.** Once complete, NAT will be converted to a security service that is injected "just in time" and will decouple the bandwidth needs of NAT from the bandwidth needs of the rest of campus. A live load test of the new service will be performed on TAMULink during Spring Break.

- **The new West Campus Data Center (WCDC) has welcomed its first tenants:** The College of Geosciences, Transportation Services, Ecosystem Science and Management from the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences and the Division of Finance.
